General Assembly - Statutory Session:

The General Assembly of 12 June 2014 agreed to the creation of a new category of FAIB Members to accept international associations based outside of Belgium, i.e.: "corresponding members", without voting right.

12 June 2014- FAIB General Assembly - Keynote speech by Mr Peder Christensen, Policy Officer at Industrial Competitiveness Policy for Growth DG Enterprise & Industry, European Commission

On behalf of DG Enterprise & Industry, Mr Christensen commented the updated views of the Commission regarding the place and perspective of Business Services (BS) in the European economy. He illustrated in particular the diagnosis made by the High Level Group (HLG) in charge of this sector and recommendations it presented in April 2014. Associations are invited to extend their participation in the industrial renaissance of EU member states.

Lunch-debate 6 May 2014

2014 a transition year: challenges for the EU and advocacy activities by Mr Charles Laroche, Laroche Conseil and Mr Aart van Iterson. Chairman EPACA/Cambre Associates

Mr Laroche's presentation was an analysis of the likely impact of the results of the European Elections on 25 May 2014. How will the new European Parliament (with half its members newly elected) shape the EU policies for the 5 years to come. How to use the comitology system falling from the Lisbon Treaty? It is clear that associations will have to work earlier and more upstream.

In his capacity of chairman of EPACA, Mr Iterson presented the European Public Affairs Consultancies' Association and its code of conduct that has a 12-point code of best practices for public affairs professionals working in consultancies in the EU sphere. European Association Summit (EAS) 14 - 15 May 2014

The theme of this year's summit was: "Shaping Your Association for the Future" Inspire, Connect, Empower. The presentations can be found on EAS website: http://webcasting.streamdis.eu/Mediasite/Catalog/Full/faae65f590e344189d17da741536c6aa21 The audience was informed of the creation of an **Executive Master in International Associations Management**.

In a dedicated meeting by Ms Céline Fremault (Minister of Economy, Employment & Research - Brussels Capital Region), the FAIB drew attention to 3 major areas where INPAs would welcome improvement: heavy procedure in hiring extern; complex VAT procedures floating from the Belgian transcription of EU Directive, support from authorities in developing a more up to date international associations centre (or adapt the existing MAI). The FAIB also reiterated the need for a "one-stop-shop" to assist international associations to which it would be happy to cooperate. International Standards on Combating Money Laundering and the Financing of Terrorism & Proliferation - the FATF/GAFI * Recommendations (* Financial Action Task Force / Groupe d'Action Financière)

Following up on the 2012 awareness campaign launched i.a. in Belgium with regards to money laundering & terrorism financing, Belgian authorities will be asked to report on the measures and legal framework put in place to implement the FATF recommendations but more importantly, to demonstrate their efficacy. In this context, FAIB reminded its members of the 2012 FATF recommendation and will take part in an interview by FATF on 4 July 2014. More: faib@faib.org

OTHER NEWS - HR- related matters

1. New Commission Paritaire / joint committee for (I)NPAs by Lorenz, International Lawyers (FAIB associate member)

Every private sector employer in Belgium is - mandatorily - a member of a joint committee (in French: "commission paritaire" / in Dutch: "paritair comité"). Joint committees are organized by business sector and are competent to conclude collective bargaining agreements ("CBAs") binding upon their members.

In the months to come, a major change will occur: members of the "white collar" JC 218 will shift to JC200. In short, the result is that all (international) non-profit associations fall under JC 337 unless another more specific JC exists. JC 337 will then effectively be the auxiliary JC or the so-called "rest category".

3. Social Contingencies

This article briefly examines some questions related to the obligation for some ASBLs and AISBLs to book a provision for social contingencies. It follows-up to questions regularly asked by FAIB members.

Large associations adopt a principle of precaution and set up allocated funds to satisfy their obligations in case of winding-up. Most of them ask their members ask their members to commit 100% (or a percentage) of the potential social contingencies. The amount is built-up in different stages. Some of them use the allowance to cover various kinds of termination costs.
